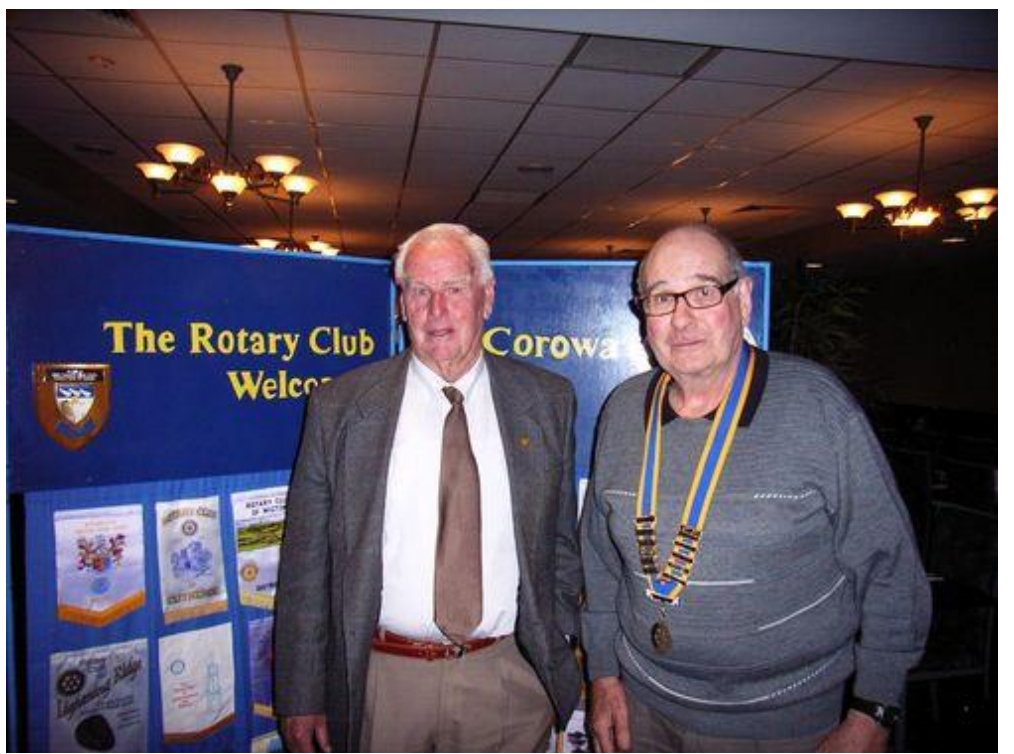

Our guest speaker this week was Keith Barber. Keith served the shire of Corowa as a councillor and Shire President for a period of 27 years.

Keith gave credit to Shire General Manager at the time, Chris Erickson for his advice and assistance, especially in his early days as a councillor.

He found the formality and the daytime format of the Corowa Shire meetings to be a distinct advantage in the good management of the shire.

Keith noted several difficult issues in his term on the shire and also a number of highlights including the construction of the Federation Bridge, keeping the ammunitions factory at Mulwala, the redevelopment of Sanger Street and the Corowa Saleyards (which are proving to be a big draw for vendors from outside our region).

The one issue which Keith believes is being underplayed by the town is the “Birthplace of Federation”. This is a major tourist drawcard for our town and he suggests this is not being utilised for the town’s advantage.

His long period of service on the Council gave Keith the opportunity to visit many places including several parliaments in Australia, host PM’s Governors General, State Governors and international dignitaries. As with any community service, commitments of personal of time and energy are more than rewarded in high achievement.
